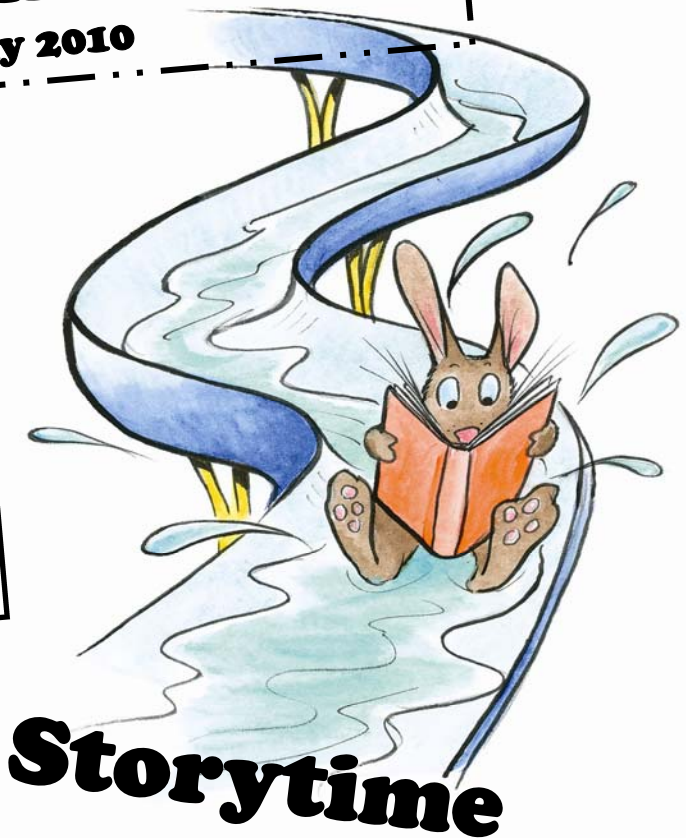


“Make a Splash, READ!” At Selby Public Library June & July 2010

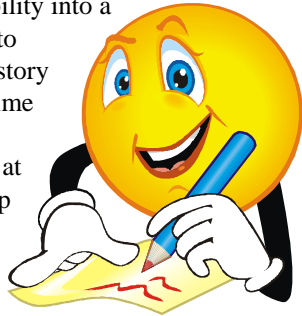
*Story-Writing Camp

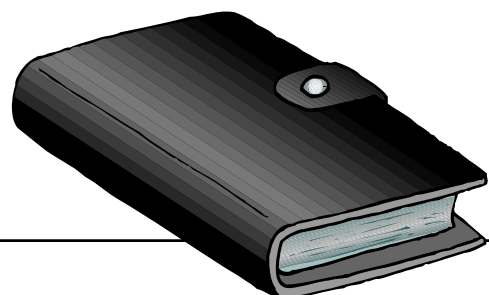
