Registration Requirements (PLEASE READ CAREFULLY)



- ⇒ For registration call **861-1130** ask for youth department.
- ⇒ **In-person registration for camps and workshops** starts **Saturday, May 2nd.**
- ⇒ **Telephone registration for camps and workshops** starts **Monday, May 11th.**
- ⇒ NO registrations will be taken on Sundays.
- ⇒ Registration limited to **TWO** programs/workshops per child.
- ⇒ All programs will start on time. Any person who is registered for a program and does not show up within 5 minutes of the start of the program will lose his/her place to someone on the waiting list.
- ⇒ 24 hours notice is required if you need to cancel participation in a program. Anyone who is registered for a program and does not call to cancel will have his/her name removed from all other registered summer activities.

No Registration Required

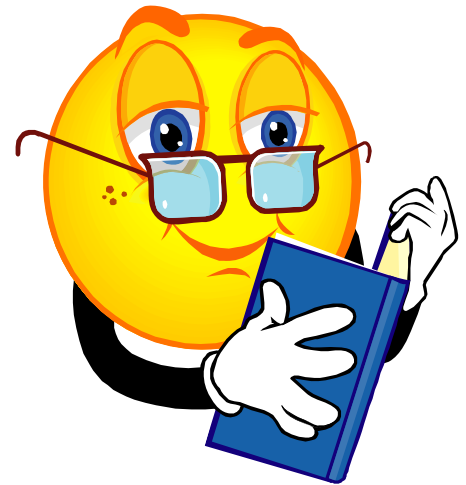

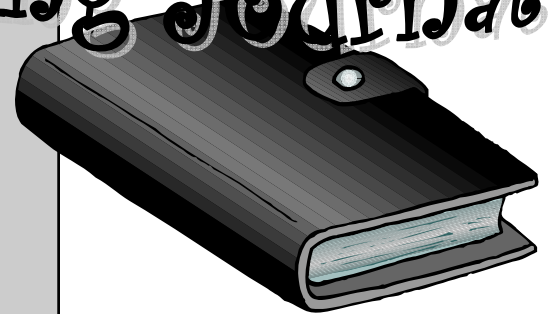

Recommended for ages 7-14 years. (JGA)

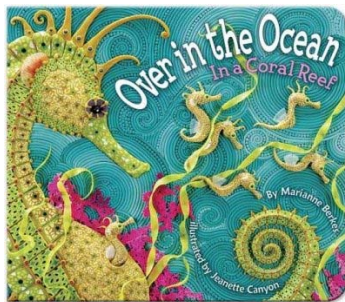
Learn the basics of juggling starting with scarves then moving to balls from professional juggler Gerard Tricarico.
